**SCHEDULING ORDER NO. 1 REGARDING
CERTAIN DISPUTED LATE CLAIM REQUESTS (GROUP 5)**

The persons listed on **Exhibit 1** attached hereto (the “Late Claimants”) have submitted requests (the “Late Claim Requests”) to the Court, asking that they be allowed to participate in the Settlement Facility-Dow Corning Trust as timely claimants. However, the Late Claim Requests do not contain enough information to allow the Court to render a decision on the merits. It is therefore ORDERED as follows:

1. Each Late Claimant must send the Court a Supplemental Statement that states in writing all reasons why the Late Claimant did not timely file a Proof of Claim or a Notice of Intent in the Dow Corning bankruptcy case by the applicable deadline¹ and why the Late Claimant believes she should be allowed to participate in the Dow Corning settlement program as a timely claimant.

2. Late Claimants must file their Supplemental Statements on the form attached as **Exhibit 2** to this Order. The Court must receive the original of the completed Supplemental Statement **no later than JUNE 29, 2007** at the following address:

The deadline for filing a Proof of Claim in the Dow Corning bankruptcy case was January 15, 1997 (or February 14, 1997 for foreign claimants), although the Bankruptcy Court allowed Proofs of Claim filed by November 30, 1999 to be considered timely. The deadline for submitting a Notice of Intent in the Dow Corning bankruptcy case was August 30, 2004.

3. **If the Court does not receive a Late Claimant's Supplemental Statement by June 29, 2007, the Court may deny such person's Late Claim Request with prejudice (that is, the Court may permanently rule that the Late Claimant cannot participate in the Dow Corning settlement program) without further notice or a hearing.**

4. The Debtor's Representatives and the Claimants' Advisory Committee shall review each Supplemental Statement and classify the related Late Claim Request as Sufficient Cause or Disputed Cause. Such Late Claim Requests will then be processed according to the procedures and orders previously approved by the Court.

5. The filing of a Supplemental Statement does not mean the Court will allow your Late Claim Request or that the Debtor's Representatives and the Claimants' Advisory Committee will not object to your Late Claim Request.

6. Within five (5) business days after the date of this Order, the Debtor's Representatives shall send a copy of this Order to each of the Late Claimants listed in Exhibit 1 and to their counsel, if known to the Debtor's Representatives.
