I. Response Regarding Order to Show Cause Related to Claim Funds for 88 Claimants

Yeon Ho Kim distributed claim funds to 72 Claimants out of the 88 Claimants (Actually 87 Claimants because Claimants 81 and 82 is the same Claimant).

The unpaid 15 Claimants are being processed for distribution.

II. Response Regarding Order to Show Cause Related to Charging Claimants Excessive and Unauthorized Amounts in Fees and Expenses

Yeon Ho Kim did not charge 38% to the 88 Claimants. Yeon Ho Kim charged ranging from 10% to 22.5% for attorneys' fees. Yeon Ho Kim charged only 5% for the expenses.

The applicable expenses for the other Claimants are various.

Yeon Ho Kim spent nearly a million dollars as chargeable expenses under Q11-4 to the Claimant Information Guide from 1994 to now.

Chargeable expenses under Q11-4 to the Claimant Information Guide are

medical evaluation expenses, expenses incurred in obtaining copies of medical records, medical bills paid, court costs, court reporter expenses, expert witness fees, expenses of medical witnesses, and travel costs incurred for depositions or court appearances.

First of all, Yeon Ho Kim spent over four hundred thousand dollars for travel costs. Yeon Ho Kim traveled to Alabama, Bay City, Detroit, New York, Washington DC, Houston nearly a hundred times from 1994 to now for court appearances including the Settlement Facility and mediation conference.

Before Confirmation hearing began, Yeon Ho Kim traveled to Alabama to meet lawyers for finding what was going on at the MDL-926 Court. Around beginning of confirmation hearing, Yeon Ho Kim traveled to New York to see a Claimants side lawyer, Mrs.Shainwald, for consulting for confirmation hearing many times. Barbara Houser, a leading Dow Corning side lawyer, called Yeon Ho Kim to visit her law firm in Houston to solicit that the Korean Claimants cast votes to consent the Proposed Dow Corning Reorganization Plan.

During confirmation hearing in Bay City, Yeon Ho Kim stayed there three month long in the year of 1999 alone.

After the case ended in December 1999 in Bay City and turned over to this Court, this Court would know how many times Yeon Ho Kim appeared before this Court.

From 2003 to 2011, Yeon Ho Kim visited the Settlement Facility in Houston many times.

Besides travel costs incurred for court appearances and for the Settlement Facility, Yeon Ho Kim hired local attorneys for the Claimants. Yeon Ho Kim hired a law firm in Bay City for preparation of confirmation hearing. Yeon Ho Kim hired a law firm in New York for objection to the Motion of Dow Silicones Corporation for approval of separate agreement with Australian Claimants to establish a settlement facility in Australia. Yeon Ho Kim had been requesting Dow Silicones Corporation to establish a settlement facility in Korea many times. Yeon Ho Kim spent over one hundred thousand dollars for hiring local attorneys for the Claimants.

Yeon Ho Kim spent mailing expenses via the Federal Express over the Claimants for 24 years from 1994 to 2018 (Yeon Ho Kim used the Federal Express only to submit claim forms for over 1,800 Claimants and correspondences with the Settlement Facility). Yeon Ho Kim spent the expenses for mailing nearly two hundred thousand dollars.

Yeon Ho Kim spent expenses for stationary and the photocopy for claims submission and subsequently exchanged correspondences for correction of submissions with the Settlement Facility about a hundred thousand dollars.

These expenses (nearly a million dollars) must be allocated proportionately

to the Claimants who received and would receive the checks.

In addition to these proportionately applicable expenses, there are medical expenses to be reimbursed from the respective Claimants.

Around 1997-1998, Dow Silicones Corporation mailed Yeon Ho Kim to urge the Claimants to explant breast implant because breast implant was dangerous to keep in the body. Yeon Ho Kim immediately distributed the News to the Claimants and arranged local plastic surgeons so that 200 Claimants ended up with explantation surgery of breast implant with no complete payments made to the surgeons. Yeon Ho Kim guaranteed the payment for surgery of explantation to the arranging surgeons. Yeon Ho Kim paid it later for the Claimants who did not pay for the surgery. These expenses for explanation must be reimbursed case by case from the respective Claimants.

In addition, Yeon Ho Kim contracted with two doctors (Doctor Yong Park, Doctor Kwan Sik Kim) to get disease evaluation for the Claimants. The two doctors were obliged to execute urine and blood test, radiation and mammogram pictures, and writing disease evaluation papers including asking each Claimant about disease conditions. Yeon Ho Kim guaranteed the disease evaluation expenses for the Claimants. The arrangement with the doctors was agreed by the Claimants. Some of Claimants paid for themselves. But there were over 300 Claimants who did not pay so Yeon Ho Kim paid it for them later. These expenses must be reimbursed case by case from the respective Claimants.

In the case of SID2783411 who submitted the Form of Compensation Payment Application to Ellen Bearicks, it turned out later that SID2783411 was not a case that the expenses for explantation surgery and disease evaluation should be applied. So Yeon Ho Kim charged 10% as attorneys' fees and remitted the rest of money to her US bank account.

When Yeon Ho Kim received a letter of Exhibit J from Ann Phillips, Yeon Ho Kim explained to the question relating to SID2783411. Yeon Ho Kim thought that a face to face meeting was desirable.

In addition, Yeon Ho Kim had inquiries to the Claims Administrator about the Korean Claims pending the Settlement Facility that Yeon Ho Kim never knew whether the remaining Claims with no notification received from the Settlement Facility were completed as "unapproved" or were still "pending" for review.

Yeon Ho Kim responded in Exhibit K letter. In the letter, Yeon Ho Kim reiterated, "Other than 10%, the remaining percentage (=38%-10%) was applied to the above expenses, If you want to know whether our law firm correctly applied the expenses to each client, I want to explain it in detail face to face".

The Claims Administrator did not reply to Exhibit K letter even if Yeon Ho Kim requested to visit the Settlement Facility and meet for explanation to her question and information for process of the Korean Claims. The Finance

Committee filed this Motion after nine months from the correspondence of

Exhibit K letter.

III. **CONCLUSION**

Yeon Ho Kim distributed claims funds of 72 Claimants out of the 88

Claimants.

With respect to attorneys' fees for Class 6.2 Claimants, Yeon Ho Kim

deducted 10% of the first 3,500 dollars, 22.5% of the next 14,000 dollars.

And with respect to attorneys' fees for Class 6.1 Claimants (SID2783411),

Yeon Ho deducted 10% of the first 6,000 dollars as attorneys' fees.

The additional percentage after deduction of 10% of attorneys' fees, if

applied, is chargeable expenses authorized under Q11-4 to the Claimant

Information Guide.
