

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING
CASE MANAGEMENT NO. 1**

Case Management Order No. 1 was entered in 2000. Due to both the passage of time and certain changed circumstances, there will be substantial revisions to this Case Management Order. The process of revising the CMO is underway and Case Management Order No. 2 will be entered when the revision process is complete. As in any complex litigation, there will be subsequent Case Management Orders to address issues as they arise.

II. Immediate Modifications to Case Management Order No. 1

- A. In order to anticipate the litigants' needs and formulate additional, useful Case Management Orders, the Court will need information from opt out litigants earlier than anticipated in CMO No. 1, ¶. Therefore, the Court will require that each opt out litigant complete a questionnaire, approved by the Court, that will be enclosed in a letter sent to you after you opt out. When you receive the letter and questionnaire, please pay careful attention to the directions on where to submit the questionnaire and the deadline to submit the questionnaire.
- B. Case Management Order No. 1 includes a reference to Magistrate Judge Marc Goldman. Magistrate Judge Goldman is no longer the Magistrate Judge assigned to this case and references to him in the CMO should be disregarded.
